Vision

- Health policy
 - Recognition of lead exposure risks, consequences, screening and mitigations
 - Establishment of governmental groups and committees
 - Inclusion in government health policy future plans
- Healthy homes and child-care facilities
 - Regulations, surveys and cleaning standards to ensure lead exposure is minimised where found and in similar homes
 - Information on how to avoid lead exposure in the home and at work
- Working practices
 - Training and accreditation for employers, contractors and tradesmen together with regulation and enforcement



Vision

Services

- Paint, dust and blood testing
- Safe disposal of lead contaminated waste
- Risk reduction consultancy services
- Lead-safe abatement, renovation and cleaning

• Products

- Elimination of lead in consumer products, food and AVGAS
- Lead testing products

• Warnings on

- Lead releasing products, e.g. ceramics
- Products that can cause lead exposure, e.g. abrasives



Focus - Working Practices

Objective - Establish a 'lead safe' training and accreditation scheme

- Actions:
 - Meet again with the National Open College Network (NOCN) and encourage them to establish training courses with accreditation
 - Identify potential demand for training services and communicate to NOCN
 - Provide the NOCN with support, if requested, to establish training courses
 - Talk to trade bodies about requiring, or encouraging, their members to take lead-safe training, e.g. The Painters and Decorators Association



- Objective Public Health England to conduct research into UK blood lead concentrations in children
 - Actions:
 - Contribute to the LEICSS prevalence study working group.
 - Offered to provide secretariat service (Done)
 - Suggest a list of possible team members (Done)
 - Develop and share a project plan discussion document. (Done, repeat)
 - Wait for PHE to organise it
 - Work with Ludovica Gazze (Warwick) and Frank DiTraglia (Oxford)
 - Seek funding (Started)



- Objective Introduction of screening of children for elevated blood lead levels.
 - Actions (When the National Screening Committee Evidence Team open the next consultation period):
 - Challenge the NSC Evidence Teams previous recommendation and their adherence to procedures (Done)
 - Engage LEAPP Alliance members
 - Contribute evidence-based comments
 - Explore what legal means are available to overturn an adverse recommendation
- New idea Screening pregnant, and pre-pregnant, women
 - Actions
 - See if LEAPP Alliance academics will help
 - By December



- Objective Include lead toxicity in the NHS Long-Term Plan and the "Giving Every Child The Best Start In Life" programme.
 - Actions:
 - Write a joint letter to Maggie Throup MP, Parliamentary Under Secretary of State (Minister for Vaccines and Public Health) Successor Jo to Churchill
 - "prevalence is likely to be higher in at-risk populations, in whom lead exposure may be a public health concern" Jo Churchill MP
 - Explain why lead exposure and poisoning is critical to children's health
 - Explain why the plan and programme are deficient



- Objective Increase housing leaders' awareness of lead risks
 - Actions,
 - Ask to present to the House of Commons Environmental Audit Committee.
 - Contact:
 - Housing associations
 - Tenants associations
 - Chartered Institute of Housing
 - Chartered Institute of Environmental Health
- Objective GPs to be taught about the dangers of lead exposure.
 - Actions:
 - Confirm that information has been disseminated about the new blood lead concentration action level of 5µg Pb/dL blood.
 - Ask for a progress report on implementation of other LEICSS recommendations.



Focus - Healthy Homes

- Objective Include lead exposure and toxicity in the <u>Healthy Homes and</u> Buildings white paper.
 - Actions:
 - Ask for our manifesto to be presented to the Healthy Homes and Buildings APPG. (Done)
 - Ask if this has been done and if there is any response
 - Ask Gill Morris (DevoConnect) for an opportunity to attend a meeting of the HHB APPG. (Done)
 - Attend a meeting and ask the question:
 - Why does the white paper not mention lead exposure?
 - Offer to help draft a new section in the white paper on lead exposure
 - Or suggest a whole white paper on the subject
- Objective Form a Lead and Health All-Party Parliamentary Group.
 - Actions:
 - Contact MPs likely to be interested including members of the health, environment and autism APPGs



Focus – Products

- Objective UK to align with the EU on lead in foodstuffs
 - Actions:
 - Write a joint letter to George Eustice MP, Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs
 - Will the UK adopt or exceed the new EU standards?



Communications Strategy

- Web sites Lead Safe World UK and LEAPP Alliance
 - What
 - Continual addition of useful material
- Social media Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn
 - What -
 - Monitoring and sharing relevant content
 - Posting information from other media where relevant
- Media
 - *What*
 - Newspapers including a press release
 - Television documentary makers
 - When -
 - After progressing the actions above
 - Or, if no progress is made



Communications Strategy

- Advertising
 - What
 - Messages targeted at health care professionals, contractors and tradesmen
 - Messages for the general public
 - When
 - After progressing the actions above
- Leafleting
 - What -
 - Produce leaflets for GP surgeries and DIY shops
 - When -
 - Once a distribution method has been found.



Focus - Communications

- Objective Hold an online meeting of LEAPP Alliance members
 - Actions:
 - Theme "How can we make it happen bring your ideas"
 - During International Lead Poisoning Prevention Week (<u>ILPPW</u>) 24–30 October?
 - Invite speakers Dr David Jacobs (NCHH), Professor Erik Millstone?
 - Others to share brief summary of their work and ideas
 - Send out invitations
 - Amend the date and time if no one can make it
 - Include in the ILPPW event schedule



Focus - Communications

- Objective Maintain and enhance communications
 - Actions:
 - Share updates and news between members of the alliance
 - Add information to the Lead-Safe World UK web pages, e.g. papers and articles about lead exposure and mitigations in the UK
 - Create a voice over version of the manifesto
